

Dubbo Regional Aboriginal Health Service (DRAHS) is seeking an enthusiastic person to fill the position of Aboriginal Health Practitioner (AHP). This role will work closely with the clinical team in the delivery of primary health care.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioners play a vital role in the primary health workforce. They provide clinical and primary health care for individuals, families and community groups. They deal with patients, clients and visitors to hospitals and health clinics. They also assist in arranging, coordinating and providing health care within the Dubbo Community. The Aboriginal Health Practitioner will undergo continuous training to fulfil this role.

NOTE: This is an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander identified position authorised by Section 14 of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977, NSW.

1. Key Selection Criteria

- Proof of Aboriginality or Torres Strait Islander (NB: applicants race is a genuine occupational qualification and is authorised by Section 14 of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977, NSW)
- Certificate III or higher in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care Practice
- Demonstrated effective communication skills
- Demonstrated ability to build rapport with patients
- Knowledge and experience using Best Practice appointment system
- Current NSW Driver's Licence
- Current NSW Working With Children Check
- Current National Criminal History Check

2. Additional Factors

- Current First Aid & CPR certificates
- Proof of vaccination must be provided upon acceptance of appointment.
